Val loved culture, the arts, music, and cooking. She was an A-class cook and people from far and wide lauded her infamous Callaloo – the best in the world. She was such an amazing cook that even when her knees troubled her, she poured her heart out into flavourful cuisine. Val could real cook! Val was a giving, kind-hearted and beautiful woman who bonded with friends and family over food. Her smile radiated and when she entered rooms her sweet aura permeated walls. Oh what a beautiful smile she had – and amazing teeth. She was a beauty indeed!

Born on February 26, 1951, Valarie was the second child of her parents, Rodney Moodie ‘Big Man City’ and Gertrude Green. She was raised on Sargangar Trace, Four Roads, Diego Martin and was fondly known for her beauty and classy demeanor. She attended the Four Roads Government Primary School followed by Wongs High School in St. James. After realizing that her childhood career aspiration, Nursing, was not something she was willing to further pursue, she began working at Reed Trinidad Ltd. in the Fernandes building. It was during that time that she met and fell in love with the Late, Great, Grandmaster of Calypso, Aldwin Roberts, the Lord Kitchener.

Valarie and Kitch shared a wonderful life together with her being his backbone and muse for some of his most iconic music hits in the 70s. She was immortalized in song when he celebrated her beauty with his mega hit ‘Sugar Bum Bum’, then the infamous ‘Flag Woman’. She captivated crowds locally and abroad with her beauty, class and dance steps while pioneering the flow of the Flag Woman dance. She shined in all her glory and secured her place in history. Valarie and Kitch then went on to have four beautiful children, Christian, Kernal, Quweina, and Kernister, all of whom she cherished and nurtured until her passing.

Val, as she was fondly called by most, loved and adored her children dearly. She devoted her life to caring for them and ensuring their wellbeing, safety and nurturing their personal and professional development. She sacrificed everything to make her children comfortable and happy, while going undone several times. She instilled Godly values, discipline, virtues, and stewardship ensuring that they remain faithful stewards of her devotion to them. She nurtured and supported the career of her son Kernal Roberts who turned out to be a world-class drummer, prolific writer and producer of some of the greatest hits in Soca music. Val sacrificed everything to ensure her only daughter, Quweina Roberts, pursued her academic goal of earning her Bachelors, Masters and Doctoral Degrees while passionately taking care of her son, Liam. Oh how she loved her Liam – her Grandson from God, as she often referred to him. Val assumed guardianship of Liam and raised him to be an astounding young man who is full of joy and a lover of God. She adored them all; Kernecia, Deandria, Kerwin, Kasia, King, and her cherished Kerlise-love. She was so full of joy when she spent time with her great-grands Aria and Emmanuel.
